

Many people also use other languages in their homes and communities.


Most people whose families came from Mexico and Central or South America belong to Latino cultures. They might speak Spanish in their homes and communities. The names of places like Florida and San Francisco also came from Spanish names.

In some communities, people speak Native American languages. Native Americans have lived in what is now the United States for thousands of years. ere are many Native American languages, luding Cherokee and Navajo. Many words and mes we use in English—such as skunk, tomato, Kentucky—are borrowed from Native American guages.

The English language comes from Europe. In me communities around the United States, people at other European languages, such as French, man, Greek, and Swedish. Kindergarten, poodle, atlas are words in English that were brought to scountry by European Americans.

Our Community Shares Cultural Traditions


Each culture has its own **traditions**. Traditions are things that people do together year after year. Traditions might involve games, sports, clothing, and the arts.
